

Summary of changes to Florida SHOTS in Release 9.2.9

Algorithm changes:

- HPV minimum interval for dose 1 to 3 has been changed to be 24w instead of 6m.

Changes affecting all users:

- Service sites listed under organizations in Florida SHOTS may now be archived. If a site which was added to your organization is no longer needed, your local Florida SHOTS administrator can contact the Florida SHOTS helpdesk to request archival. If you are a Florida SHOTS user with administrative privileges, you will notice on the “view sites” page (accessible from the bottom of the “Organization Edit” page, found in the Administration menu) that you can sort the list by “Active” sites only, “Archived” sites, or “All”.
- Administrators will also notice their personnel list is now divided in to views showing “Active”, “Inactive”, and “All” users. Users are considered inactive if they have an end date that is in the past. Users without end dates and having a password expiration date greater than 60 days in the past will automatically have an end date added for them.
- “Lab Confirmed Immunity” added as a contraindication selection for permanent contraindications when the vaccine type selected is HEP B, MEASLES, MUMPS, or RUBELLA.

Changes affecting CHD users:

- Vaccine Demand Forecast Report has been added to Florida SHOTS. This report can be used to estimate how much vaccine needs to be ordered for selected timeframes in the future based on prior usage trends.
- Inventory users are now allowed to “reverse” inventory adjustments. This action is performed on the Transaction History details page for the affected inventory record.
- By expanding the functionality of the “change expiration date” page, inventory users may now change MFG, lot #, and NDC code for any selected inventory record. Flexibility has been added which, when acknowledged by the user, changes can be saved allowing conflicting values to exist in the inventory (two different vaccine types with the same MFG lot, for example).
